Reproduced 18th century French woodblock-printed motifs

are also available. Canvas hinges linking the panels create the illusion that the screen scene is continuous.






As the seasons change, so do the centers of activity in the home. In fall, the dining room becomes busy again with friends and family gathering to share special feasts.
